A Guide to The Winstedt School Diploma

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The Winstedt School follows the UK National Curriculum in core subjects from Reception – Y13 (or K – 12) and is an EduTrust-Certified (Singapore) and ACS WASC Accredited (USA) international school in Singapore.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1) What is The Winstedt School Diploma and what is its equivalency?

The Winstedt School Diploma is a 4-year (10 months per 'year') programme of study (Year 10 through Year 13) whereby students must achieve 24 credits* to graduate and obtain the Diploma (*please refer to Question 10 for graduation requirements).

- **United Kingdom:** Equivalent to 5 General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSEs) at passing grade
- **United States:** Equivalent to a High School Diploma
- **Other countries:** Equivalent to successfully completing secondary education

2) What official body confers The Winstedt School Diploma?

The Winstedt School was granted approval on 20 April 2021 by the Committee for Private Education (CPE), SkillsFuture Singapore, Ministry of Education, to issue a Diploma to our students who successfully complete the course requirements to graduate.

3) What is Committee for Private Education (CPE)?



The Committee for Private Education (CPE) is an agency under the SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG) within the Ministry of Education of Singapore. CPE was established under the Private Education Act of 2009, giving CPE legislative power to regulate the private education sector in Singapore. As such, The Winstedt School is registered and regulated by CPE (which is the case with all international schools operating in Singapore). The CPE was created to ensure that private education institutions including international schools level-up and continue to have high standards in the local private education industry.

4) What is SkillsFuture Singapore?



SkillsFuture Singapore (SSG) which governs CPE is a statutory board under the Ministry of Education in Singapore. Statutory boards of the Singapore Government, like SSG, are organisations that have been given autonomy to perform an operational function by legal statutes passed as Acts in parliament. The statutes define the purpose, rights, and powers of the authority. The statutory boards usually report to one specific ministry, and in this case, SSG reports to the Ministry of Education.

5) I understand that The Winstedt School is officially certified by CPE. What are the requirements and certifications under CPE, and what requirements has The Winstedt School met?

(1) **Enhanced Registration Framework** (ERF): ERF sets out the basic standards that a Private Education Institution (PEI) must adhere to in order to operate as an international school in Singapore.

The Winstedt School maintains a 4-year ERF which was renewed on 28 June 2020 and is effective until 27 June 2024. It is renewed every 4 years.

(2) **EduTrust Certification Scheme** (EduTrust): EduTrust is a quality assurance scheme administered by CPE for select international schools and private education institutions in Singapore. It aims to distinguish private schools that consistently maintain a high standard of quality in the overall provision of education services and governance, and make continual improvements that lead to positive student outcomes. The EduTrust Certification also enables the school to issue student passes for international students residing outside of Singapore via Singapore's Immigration & Checkpoints Authority (ICA).

The Winstedt School was awarded the four-year EduTrust certification in 2024 which is effective until 2028. It is renewed every 4 years.

6) I understand The Winstedt School attained “WASC Accreditation”. What is WASC and what does it mean to be WASC accredited?



The Winstedt School attained full WASC accreditation in February 2022 for all year levels from Reception to Y13 (or K-12). The Accrediting Commission for Schools, [Western Association of Schools and Colleges](#) (WASC) is an accrediting association based in the United States that is widely considered as a world-renowned accrediting agency and works closely with the Office of Overseas Schools under the U.S. Department of State. The accreditation validates the school as a trustworthy institution for student learning and the integrity of the school's programme and transcripts. It also helps to facilitate transfer of credits to other English-speaking schools which is critical for college/university acceptance worldwide. The Winstedt School joins over 5,000 schools worldwide, which includes select international schools, that are ACS WASC accredited.

7) If the Diploma is WASC accredited, does that mean that the Diploma is a U.S. (American) High School Diploma?

While the Winstedt Diploma is equivalent to a high school diploma in the U.S., The Winstedt School Diploma is not an American High School Diploma *per se*. This is because Winstedt is not a school based in the U.S., but an international school based in Singapore, governed by the Singapore Government.

8) I know that Winstedt uses the UK National Curriculum. What does this mean in terms of what the Diploma means?

Throughout Secondary School, for core subjects (English, Maths, and Science) students cover content up to and including Key Stage 4. When a student successfully meets the course requirements to graduate, a Diploma is conferred – which is equivalent to 5 GCSEs at passing grade in the UK. For students in Years 12 and 13 that excel in their core subjects, extension work may be aligned to Key Stage 5.

9) When my student obtains the Diploma at Winstedt, what does this mean in terms of being able to apply for universities and colleges in Singapore or outside of Singapore in other countries?

Students who have obtained The Winstedt School Diploma are eligible to apply to any post-secondary educational institutions including colleges and universities worldwide. It is important to note that admissions criteria vary from country to country and institution to institution.

- If a student is planning to go straight to university after graduating from Winstedt, students may need SAT/AP exams. For this, we recommend an external provider such as PrepZoneAcademy.
- Another option for a student is to apply to a foundational course or a vocational college. These mostly have pathways/links to university programmes.

10) What does my student need to obtain the Diploma?

The Winstedt School Diploma is a 4-year programme of study (Year 10 through Year 13) whereby students must achieve the following credits to graduate and obtain the Diploma:

- 4 years (8 semesters) within Secondary School are needed with a minimum of 24 credits earned during Years 10 – 13 to obtain the TWS Diploma
- 1 credit is awarded for successful completion of a full-year course
- Graduation is only allowed in Year 13
- *While most credits are timetabled, students need to ensure they consider extension courses and electives in consultation with their homeroom teachers and Head of School to ensure they achieve credits within all categories.

Transcript

For a student starting in Year 10, their schedule will be designed to ensure that the student achieves all credits. For those joining after Year 10, we will look at previous school reports and will decipher whether a student is at ‘passing grade’ in each credit category. This will be reflected in the final transcript to confer the diploma.

Our WASC accreditation validates Winstedt as a trustworthy institution for student learning and the integrity of our school’s programme and transcripts. It also helps to facilitate transfer of credits to other English-speaking schools which is critical for college/university acceptance worldwide. All Winstedt transcripts and Diploma will be embossed with the ACS WASC Accreditation seal.



Career/Post-Graduation Support

Throughout Secondary School, students are engaged in a discussion about their next steps and pathways. Our Career Studies Electives give students the opportunity to gain experience, knowledge, and skills in a wide range of subjects. They also provide students with the opportunity to understand what it is like to study in a university/college and/or vocational learning environment. The Winstedt School has a partnership with various tertiary educational institutions including Raffles Institute of Higher Education, Singapore University of Social Sciences, The William Angliss Institute, International Sports Academy, At-Sunrice GlobalChef Academy, Singapore University of the Arts, Les Roches, James Cook University and other vocational institutions.

In Year 13, students have a mandatory course in Career's Guidance whereby they follow a scheme of work in enhancing employability skills and receive support, advice and guidance as they address their pathways and make important decisions about their post-secondary journey.
